
I am writing to commend you for your wonderful project, Adoptaflag.Org.

A RESOLUTION ENCOURAGING LOUISVILLE METRO CITIZENS TO PARTICIPATE IN THE ADOPT A FLAG PROGRAM TO SEND 10,000 U.S. FLAGS TO DECORATE THE GRAVES OF U.S. VETERANS BURIED IN THE NORMANDY, FRANCE AMERICAN CEMETERY.

WHEREAS, on June 6, 1944, better known as D-Day, American forces during World War II bravely made heroic landings into hostile fire as part of military operations in and around Normandy, France; and

WHEREAS, many American troops lost their lives during these landings and subsequent operations; and

WHEREAS, the World War II Normandy American Cemetery is situated on a cliff overlooking Omaha Beach and the English Channel in Normandy, France; and

WHEREAS, this cemetery is the final resting place for 9,387 American soldiers, who gave their lives in order to ensure a safer America and a better world; and

WHEREAS, in order to honor these soldiers for their heroic deeds and valor, Adoptaflag.org hopes to decorate their graves with U.S. Flags; and


WHEREAS, as of to date, Louisville schools, scouting groups and local businesses have joined Adoptaflag.org to try to make this wish a reality.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF THE LOUISVILLE/JEFFERSON COUNTY METRO GOVERNMENT ("METRO COUNCIL") AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Metro Council hereby urges all Louisville Metro citizens and businesses to participate in whatever way they can to help Adoptaflag.org send 10,000 U.S. flags to decorate the graves of the brave military soldiers who gave their lives during World War II and reside in the World War II Normandy American Cemetery.

Section 2. This Resolution shall take effect upon its passage and approval.

Dear Applicant:

We are pleased to inform you that upon review of your application for tax exempt status we have determined that you are exempt from Federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Contributions to you are deductible under section 170 of the Code. You are also qualified to receive tax deductible bequests, devises, transfers or gifts under section 2055, 2106 or 2522 of the Code. Because this letter could help resolve any questions regarding your exempt status, you should keep it in your permanent records.


Organizations exempt under section 501(c)(3) of the Code are further classified as either public charities or private foundations. During your advance ruling period, you will be treated as a public charity. Your advance ruling period begins with the effective date of your exemption and ends with advance ruling ending date shown in the heading of the letter.

Shortly before the end of your advance ruling period, we will send you Form 8734, Support Schedule for Advance Ruling Period. You will have 90 days after the end of your advance ruling period to return the completed form. We will then notify you, in writing, about your public charity status.

Please see enclosed information for Exempt Organizations Under Section 501(c)(3) for some helpful information about your responsibilities as an exempt organization.

If you distribute funds to other organizations, your records must show whether they are exempt under section 501(c)(3). In cases where the recipient organization is not exempt under section 501(c)(3), you must have evidence the funds will be used for section 501(c)(3) purposes.
