Thanks to the efforts of our dedicated board members, volunteers, donors and Color-Goldwater Hospital, Angelica has quickly built momentum and become a reality.

Angelica is made up of twelve women dedicated to enhancing the lives of economically disadvantaged patients in need of long-term medical care. In the words of Claude Ritman, Executive Director of Coler-Goldwater Hospital, Angelica has "spent an enormous amount of time here, organized many events and become close friends with our patients and residents, making a tremendous difference in their quality of life. We also had a visit from the Lady Cavaliers, an all female theatrical group dedicated to

strengthening the image of women. These ladies, many of whom act as stunt doubles for actresses, gave a presentation of their sword-fighting skills to about 100 patients. The Lady Cavaliers visited with patients during a reception after the show.

Patient Update

Our dear friend, Kim suffers from Fibrodysplasia Ossificans Progressiva, a condition in which her body turns normal muscle tissue into bone. Kim experiences flare-ups of this rare disease, and she recently lost her ability to walk. Angelica will organize and fund van transportation for Kim, accompanied by a friend, to visit a leading specialist in this field in Philadelphia in early November.

Fundraising

We hosted our largest fund raiser to date, the Farewell to Summer BBQ Blast in September, on Roosevelt Island. Fifty patients joined about 25 donors for hamburgers, hotdogs, a band, and face painting and fortune telling. We celebrated with old friends and new friends alike.

Yvonne, one of Coler-Goldwater's most prolific and talented painters, spoke at the event, as did Claude Ritman, Executive Director of the hospital, and Ron Becker, Director of Therapeutic Recreation.



We also had a smaller fundraising event in July at Bendel's, where the ladies gathered for a Laura Mercier Master Class, hors d'oeuvres and champagne.
