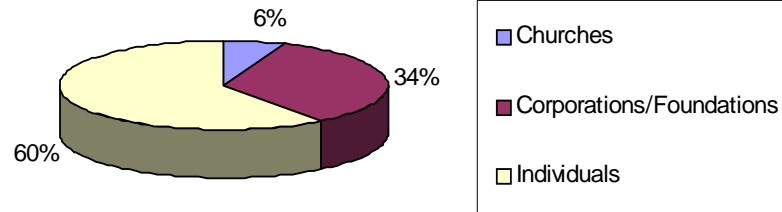


Giving Synopsis for 2006

It is at these times that the Lord reminds me of the vision he gave the prophet Ezekiel. While standing in the middle of a valley of dry bones, the Lord asked Ezekiel if the bones could live. The prophet replied, "Lord, you are the only one who knows" (37:3). Then God told Ezekiel to prophesy to the bones that they might live. Obeying God, Ezekiel prophesied and life was restored in the dry bones. "... there was noise, and behold a shaking and the bones came together, bone to bone. And, . . . lo, the sinews and the flesh came upon them, and skin covered them" (37:7-8).

God has given a vision to us at Cornerstone Christian Academy to be a beacon of light and hope for children in southwest Philadelphia. Daily we proclaim to our students that they can experience new and abundant life in Jesus and that the cycle of despair so prevalent in their surroundings can be broken with a quality education. Indeed, the facts show that our efforts are worthwhile. Over 95% of Cornerstone's graduates earn a high school degree (compared to well under 50% from the neighborhood), and nearly two-thirds

Our goal in these activities and in the classroom is to develop young Christian leaders. Please pray that our students will continue to work hard and believe in their God-given abilities to achieve.

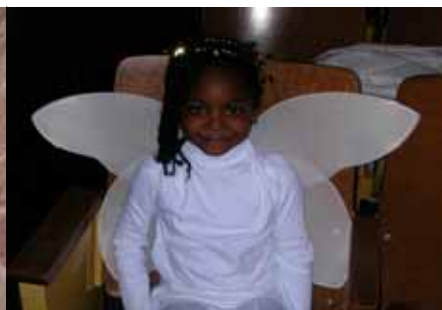
IN FOCUS: The Cornerstone story is diverse and unfolding before our eyes: students, parents, staff and friends making a difference together.
